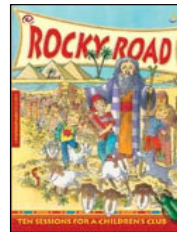

What a great summer we've enjoyed – beautiful weather, day after day. I hope that you've been able to get out and soak in some of the sun's rays. Perhaps you were abroad and were jealously looking at the fine weather back home!

Already it is beginning to darken earlier in the evening and some of the foliage is beginning to change from the green of summer to the more golden colours of autumn. So why not get out there and enjoy what's left of this great summer God has given us!

As I write it is the day before the schools reopen for the autumn term and soon many of the activities in our church begin to restart giving young and old and those in-between an opportunity to get involved again in the life of our church family.

One exciting new development about to start on the 9th September is "Rocky Road" -- a club for children and their families in the Pitcorthie area. This will be held on the second Saturday afternoon each month and will build on the relationships begun during the great "Pyramid Rock" holiday club held in July at Pitreavie Primary. It will also give an opportunity for further contact with the children who come along to SU groups in our three primary schools, and will be a key part of our strategy to develop our life as a mission focussed congregation.



Another valuable event for every parent and grandparent is the "Drug Proof Your Kids" course which has been specially designed to offer parents a realistic plan to steer their children away from the harmful use of drugs. This short course will begin on Thursday 7th September in St. Andrew's Erskine (near the hospital). It is being run in conjunction with the church in the eastern expansion, St. Paul's East, and will be led by Chris Beattie and Elizabeth Philip.

Finally, we will be running a new "Alpha" Course on Thursday evenings over the Autumn. "Alpha" is a great way to meet other people and consider some of the basics of the Christian faith. Again, this course is a key part of our mission strategy and will be suitable for those who have no faith, those who are new to the faith and those who simply want a refresher. It's great fun and exhorts absolutely no pressure on its participants. "Alpha" will begin late September / early October.

The Rev Dr Jon M Walton, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, New York, which lies only yards from the former twin towers of the World Trade Centre, reflects on life in New York five years on from the bombing.

PRAYING FOR PEACE

The Church of Scotland's new minister in Jerusalem, the Rev Jane Barron, formerly minister of Stobswell Church, Dundee) offers her first impressions from a land beset by a new war in the Middle East.

'TIME FOR REFLECTION'

The Liberal-Democrat MSP Donald Gorrie, who is stepping down at the next parliamentary election, is the subject of this month's profile. He describes Holyrood as "a legislative sausage machine" and claims there is insufficient time for proper scrutiny. "We need a system of revisiting bills reasonably soon after they take effect to see if they are working," he says.

As the debate on civil partnerships begins in Church of Scotland Presbyteries, Editor Lynne McNeil urges the Kirk to set aside differences and focus on the issues which truly count. Christians within the Church of Scotland have much more in common than that which divides them, she says, adding that a prophetic voice and strong and powerful leadership is more important than "a face which appears only interested in itself with damaging internal divisions".

A Kirk-led group in Callander is offering support for people experiencing the difficulties of divorce and separation. Heart to Heart, is based at Callander Kirk Hall and has attracted funding from Stirling Council.
